From Homer To Hollywood: The Ancient World in Film

Led by John Hayden

Introduction to Reading Group:

From Homer to Hollywood will examine the ways in which aspects of the classical world have been depicted in film, and what the filmmaker's usage (and abusage) of this ancient material can say to us about our own experiences and knowledge of the classical world.

Using a variety of cinematic sources, we delve into the insights these give us about ancient society, uncovering how core ideas – including kleos, timé, arête, furor, pietas, and other ancient notions about gender, sexuality, and community – can be observed through the prism of modern cinema.

Discussion then turns to how successfully these ancient ideals have been reframed for modern society. Learners will be encouraged to share their own cinematic proclivities, which provides agency, and promotes a practical chance to apply the skills that this course aims to develop.

Reading Group Objectives:

- To make the Classical world accessible to a wide range of ākonga (learners), in a way which makes them feel safe, comfortable, and validated
- To trace a lineage between ancient texts and modern cinema and explore how classical ideals still resonate today
- To encourage, develop, and/or hone critical thinking skills among group participants
- To empower learners to bring their own experiences to bear, and provide agency in their learning by co-constructing a reading/listening list, as appropriate
- To enhance my own pedagogical awareness through inviting input from ākonga

Week 2: No More Heroes?

As the needs of a society change, so do the demands on its heroes. These heroes come in many guises, whether in the at-times trashy pepla, – with Steve Reeves' portrayal of Hercules as the focal point – the ground-breaking Jason and The Argonauts (1963), the space-opera in excelsis Star Wars, or the Deep south odyssey of O Brother, Where Art Thou?., In this session, we delve into the heroic qualities of these on-screen icons.

Week 3: Conquest and Empire

Though films such as Alexander (2004) and 300 (2006) espouse a number of virtues (alongside bringing key classical personages and events back into public consciousness), there remain overpowering notions of imperialism, masculinity, and 'otherness' within. This session discusses the extent to which these are presented on-screen, and how invoking history through a particular prism can have unintended consequences.
